

Provision of Infrastructure facilities in Government schools

Strengthening of Existing Schools - Elementary & Secondary

Access to school will not be confined to mere availability of school but it will contain all the provisions that are required to attract and retain children in school till their completion of education. Provisions such as proper classrooms, adequate & functional toilets, drinking water facility, ramps, etc. are necessary part of any school building and shall have to be provided.

Brief Objective:

- The Integrated Scheme on School Education aims to achieve universal access of children in schools from Pre-primary to Higher Secondary an inclusive and equitable manner, focusing on quality of education with improved infrastructure in the schools.
- The goal of infrastructure development is to provide joyful environment, increase school attendance and improve academic performance of students.
- Structured environment leads to enhance the teaching learning process.

Modalities of implementation and justification

With respect to Elementary Education, Execution of Civil Works is to be undertaken with community involvement. Planning and implementation by the community through SMC in all infrastructure development activities will be mandatory. All works costing up to Rs.30 lakh will be executed preferably through SMC.

With respect to Secondary Education, infrastructure facilities sanctioned towards Upgradation of New schools and strengthening of High and Higher Secondary schools are executed by SMDC / State Public Works Department / Other Government working agencies.

Expected Out comes

School and community involvement, in any infrastructure programme increases local ownership, improves the planning process, ensures local priorities are addressed, provides oversight and promotes better maintenance. Infrastructure programmes have the potential to play a role in strengthening school management. Favourable attitude towards school infrastructure leads to school attendance and motivation that again improves literacy rates of the locality.

Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)

- To ensure all Elementary Schools are provided with Drinking water facilities, Ramp with handrails, Functional Toilet for boys and girls, Boundary walls and Hand washing facilities.
- To ensure all Secondary/ Senior Secondary Schools are provided with Library Rooms, Drinking water facilities, Ramp with handrails, Functional Toilet for boys and girls, Boundary walls and Hand washing facilities.

- Percentage of overcrowded, underutilized and unutilized classroom in all Government schools.
- Ratio of total boys'/girls' enrolment to total number of boys'/girls' toilet in Elementary / Secondary/ Senior Secondary schools.

Monitoring of the KPIs

District level and Block level Engineers engaged under Samagra Shiksha have been instructed to monitor the Key Performance Indicators in all Government schools to ensure that the gap in these facilities are identified and filled over the period of two to three years. The report of the same is generated through EMIS and through SMC / NGO contribution, CSR initiatives and in convergence with other Departments, steps are taken to bridge these gaps.
