

## **Reimbursement of Fees against 25% admission under Section 12(1)C of RTE Act,2009**

### **Objective**

RTE Act, 2009& Tamil Nadu RTE rules 2011 provides a platform to reach the unreached, with specific provisions for disadvantaged groups and weaker sections. The detailed table is given below:

Children of Scavengers</li></ol>	It refers to “a child belonging to such parent or guardian whose annual income is below Rs.2 Lakh.

### **Implementation**

#### **1. RTE Awareness Campaign**

To create awareness in the society, awareness rallies, campaigns were conducted by the children. Pamphlets were distributed to the masses about the importance of RTE. Competitions like drawing, essay, oratory were conducted on RTE to spread awareness in society. Posters and handouts were distributed.

#### **Media:**

All District Officials of the School Education Department issued a press release notifying the beginning of admission in recognised non-minority private unaided schools.

**Principals meeting:**

The Directorate of Matriculation Schools conducted RTE School Principals meeting at the beginning of the academic year.

**2. On-line Admission through TNEMIS**

1. Entry-level class and intake capacity of recognised non-minority private unaided schools has been obtained from the Chief Educational Officers through online.
2. Online application has been developed to submit their application seeking admission under the RTE reserved seats.
3. All applications are to be classified as "Eligible", "Document Missing" or "Not Eligible". It will not be possible to make changes to these details after the specified time as the admission screen will be locked.
4. After completion of selection of candidates through lots, the selected candidates and waitlisted candidates' details should be updated in the CEO login in EMIS.
5. All students selected through lots, and all waitlisted candidates from the first round of application and second round of applications should be updated in this admission screen.
6. All students should be classified as "Not Allotted", "Allotted" or "Waiting list". Only after completion of this step, schools will be able to admit students through RTE admission option in the school login.
7. Students should be admitted using RTE application number only. Only students who are marked as "Allotted", "Waiting list" will be allowed to be admitted in the school.
8. The report will be generated at the State level to get the final list of admitted candidates through EMIS.
9. The Director of Matriculation Schools (State nodal officer for RTE) has formed a committee comprising of High/Higher Secondary school Headmaster, Block Educational Officer, Block Resource Teacher Educator, and a Clerical Staff check the details of admission procedure through verification of the Application Issued Register, Children

Selected Register, Admission Register in the appropriate entry-level class and Reimbursement Claimed Register. The committee also looks into the Special Children (IE) admission as per norms.

10. If the committee certifies that all the above-said procedures are correct, the fund for reimbursement is released by the state office through Public Financial Management System (PFMS) to the school account.
11. The district-level officials of the Directorate ensure that the UC (Utilization Certificate) is duly signed and submitted in time.
